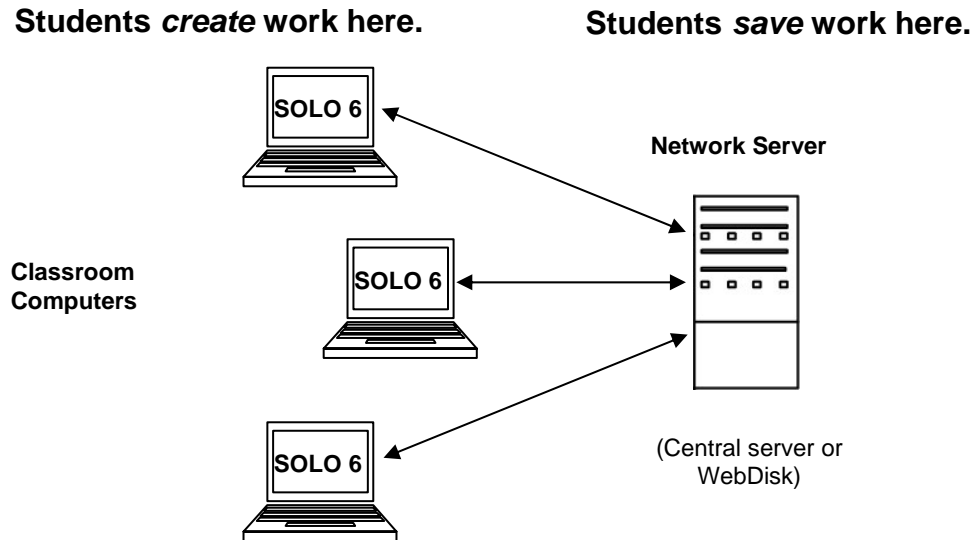


How to Use SOLO 6, Co:Writer 6, Read:OutLoud 6, Write:OutLoud 6 and Draft:Builder 6 on Your Network

SOLO 6, Co:Writer 6, Read:OutLoud 6, Write:OutLoud 6 and Draft:Builder 6 are network-ready. This means that you can save your work anywhere on your Windows or Macintosh network. If your district has set up its own save-process guidelines, you can set it up to work the same way. When you do this, teachers have access to all student work.

How does this work? The program is installed on each authorized computer. When it comes time to save your work, you can save it on the network. It is recommended that teachers specify a certain location so that everyone knows where to find their work.

Below is an example using SOLO 6:



Save your files on the network in categories that will be easy to remember and find. For example, if you have three students named Chris, Pat and Joe, you might set up the following folders on your network:

- (network drive=S):\Students\Chris
- (network drive=S):\Students\Pat
- (network drive=S):\Students\Joe

Note: Teachers can also save their assignments and eText anywhere on the network. Tell your students where this location is and they can easily get the assignments or eText from the network and put them on their own computer. Here, they can work on the assignment or eText.
